One day Kathmandu Sightseeing tour, explore most visit durbar squares, monasteries, temples and monuments in our one-day Kathmandu city sightseeing. Kathmandu Sightseeing tour includes the must see monuments of Kathmandu valley. Meet your tour guide in the morning and drive to swayambhunath, which place offers spectacular views of Kathmandu valley & snow capped peaks. Afterwards, we travel to the boudhanath. In Boudha, we explore Buddhist monastery, stupas and walk the streets, see the Sherpa and Tibetan culture. In the afternoon, visit Phasupati Temple, which is a biggest Hindu temple. Thereafter, we drive to patan city - the famous beautiful city of Kathmandu valley. Finally we drive back to hotel.

Tour Duration: Kathmandu sightseeing is a full day tour, usually from 8:00 am - 5:00 pm but ultimately depends upon where you're staying and how long is spent at each location.

Itinerary Details

Day 01 : Morning 8:00 Am minibus pickup from your kathmandu Hotel

We visit following 2 places in the morning: Swayambunath: The Affente Temple, sometimes called Swayambunath, is also a special place of interest in Kathmandu with its stupa grounds and the wonderful view over the Kathmandu Valley. The ascent to the ornate temple is quite steep and there are many monkeys on the way, which accompany all guests on their way to the stupa facility. Particularly impressive are the numerous prayer mills, which provide a unique image and explain the fame of Swayambunath. Patan: Patan is the oldest town in the valley was founded over 2,300 years ago and is a special place of interest on every trip to Nepal. Patan has a special charm and charming buildings, which you cannot miss. Explore the impressive Durbar Square, the Golden Temple and the Temple of the Thousand Buddhas. Another highlight in Patan is the well-known five-storey pagoda. Discover Patan's cultural treasures and get to know the warm Nepali, who has always kept their friendly and open style in spite of all natural catastrophes. Pashupatinath Temple: One of the most sacred Hindu temples of Nepal - Pashupatinath Temple is located on both banks of Bagmati River on the eastern outskirts of Kathmandu. Pashupatinath is the most important temple dedicated to god Shiva. Every year this temple attracts hundreds of elderly followers of Hinduism. They arrive here to find shelter for the last several weeks of their lives, to meet death be cremated on the banks of the river and travel their last journey with the waters of the sacred river Bagmati, which later meets the holy river Ganges. Hinduists from every corner of Nepal and India are arriving here to die. Boudhanath: Boudhanath Stupa (or Bodnath Stupa) is the largest

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stupa in Nepal and the holiest Tibetan Buddhist temple outside Tibet. It is the center of Tibetan culture in Kathmandu and rich in Buddhist symbolism. The stupa is located in the town of Boudha, on the eastern outskirts of Kathmandu.
